

CLARK COUNTY R-1 SCHOOL BOARD  
REGULAR MEETING - OPEN SESSION  
November 11, 2020

The Clark County R-1 Board of Education met its regular session on November 11, 2020 at 7:00 pm in the High School Library at 680 E. Main St. Kahoka, MO 63445. Mark Plenge, President, called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Motion made by Jason Acklie, seconded by Craig Hunziker to approve the consent agenda as presented.

Mr. Harper spoke about the Vocation Programs at the high school. Offered are Vocational agriculture, building trades, business, family and consumer science. We also have the new agreement with Southeastern Community College in Keokuk, Iowa. Through SCC we have students involved in automotive technology, industrial maintenance, and the CNA program. The students that are participating in the SCC programs are reporting success and great appreciation for the opportunities.

Dr. Kracht presented 3 bids for the request for a proposal to locate and fix all leaks on the roof of the high school building, coat all seams, boots, and curbing around HVAC units and add flashing of the west roof line. Bids were submitted from David Summy for \$4,000, Show Me Coatings, \$10,175, and CCS for \$10,741.

Motion was made by Jason Acklie, seconded by Doug James to accept the bid from David Summy for \$4,000.

Dr. Kracht gave an update on the COVID numbers: currently we have 204 students nad 10 staff quarantined. These quarantines all came into effect before the high school and middle school went to orange. With these students now going every other day, it will most likely reduce the number of quarantines in the future. The health department through an agreement with the school district have done over 70 tests in 1 week for students and staff. The Board members thanked the teachers and all staff for all of their cooperation and hard work during this difficult time, and a big thank you to Ardith Harmon, District nurse, for all of her long hours and hard work. Dr. Kracht and Ardith thanked the health department for their cooperation and help.

Dr. Kracht presented the new 2020 policies update from MSBA. The policies are: BBFA, DC, DFI (new), DJF, GBAD (new), GBEBB, GCBA, IC, IHB, IKF, JCB, JCC, JECA, JFG, JFGA(new), JG, JHCB. He recommended on policies BBFA and GBCA the Board keep a \$100 limit and add “per district approval” to #7 on page 5 on policy IKF. Dr. Kracht recommended accepting all other policies as presented by MSBA with the exceptions listed above.

Motion was made by Jason Acklie, seconded by Heather Webster to approve the polices as presented with the recommended changes.
